# Eight Flowers Eight Ways

These are the exact art supplies I use to create the demo videos and illustrated printable pages. You may prefer to use supplies you already have, and that's perfectly fine. Your results may be different... and that's fine, too.

If the suggested brands are not available where you live, feel free to substitute. Please avoid anything labeled "student" or "academy" grade, which tend to be lesser quality and can be difficult to work with. For the same reason, never buy the generic or store brands (such as Artist's Loft or Master's Touch) sold by Michaels and Hobby Lobby.

- 4B drawing pencil
  - Kneaded eraser
  - Sketchbook, any kind you like, 8x10 or larger
  - Small bottle of black waterproof India Ink (Speedball, Higgins, or Parker)
  - Pad of 140lb cold pressed watercolor paper, 9x12 (Strathmore, Arches, Fabiano)
  - 3 watercolor brushes: #1 round, #4 round, #10 round (I love the yellow nylon "golden taklon" synthetic brushes, which are inexpensive and durable and perform very well. Sometimes they are called "synthetic sable.")
  - Something roomy upon which to mix your watercolors: a palette or an old china plate
  - 4 tubes of watercolor: quinacridone rose or magenta, ultramarine blue, cadmium yellow light, and burnt sienna
  - 1 tube of white gouache (any brand)
  - Waterproof drawing pen with a fine tip and black ink (Pigma Micron, Pitt)
